Marty is a former pediatrician with degrees from the University of New York. District 5340 is one of 500+ districts in the world. Our district was selected as a Pilot District for Future Visions Plan. The goal of the Future Visions Plan is sustainability for projects that are implemented. Our district sent 2 vocational training teams to Nairobi Kenya to train nurses. Marty led his team to improve child health for the Zulu people of South Africa. There are 10 million children there. The unemployment rate is 60% and the average life expectancy is 43 years. There is a large HIV positive population and TB is rampant. Marty’s group included doctors and nurses from Rady Children’s Hospital. They focused on better triage, education for health providers on identifying which children have the most urgent medical needs and they taught occupational therapists how to play and interact with children.
